Seva: Cleaning Teachers Notes

- Seva "selfless service", work or service performed without any thought of reward or personal benefit.
 In Sanatan religion (Hindu religion) are encouraged by the scripture to perform Seva or Selfless Service. This is not only good for community relations but also is good for the moral uplifting of the person.
- Helping mum and dad is as responsible person duty- Volunteer work; selfless service;
- Helping poor and needy is duty as human being -Volunteer work; selfless service
- Serving Bhagwan is for salvation to serve your ultimate guru (swami)- work offered to Bhagwan selfless service
 - 2. Explain why it is important to understand what Seva is, including:
- · Seva is meant to be done selflessly. It is done without ego
- Seva can be done in the home, at the Mandir or within the community
- Seva is done whenever you are free. One should make time to do Seva

- 4. Whilst looking at the images we can say:
- This Seva is called Daasatva Bhakti which they will know in detail in future lessons. Daasatva Bhakti means they are like a servant.
- One should follow the commandments of Bhagwan by:
 - o Cleaning the Mandir
 - Help in building works of the Mandir
 - Gardening
 - Making flower garlands (haar)

- Decoration of the Mandir for a festival
- o Preparing and cooking meals for Bhagwan and Devotees
- Serving food to Devotees during festivals
- During construction works Saints and Devotees all help out. This was all for free and no one got paid any money. Devotees use to spend 10 to 14 hours a day, 7 days a week until works have been completed.
- Young children come after school and help out at weekends
- Are cooking or doing Seva for Bhagwan daily?
